Your child is learning to determine the author's point of view and to decide if they agree or disagree with that point of view.

- What information do you agree with?
- What information do you disagree with?
- Can you explain what you were thinking when you read ___?

You can practice this standard with your child using any non-fiction text. When reading a book with your child, discuss what the author wants us to learn in the text. Now, do you agree or disagree with what the author shared?

When helping your child with this standard, look for resources in which the author takes a stance on something. For example, research about Sea World's Killer Whales and find articles for keeping the whales in captivity, and articles about releasing the whales. Allow your child to read this information and then determine the point of view of each author. Then, ask your child what their point of view is.
